Legislation in force

- Pressure Equipment Directive (PED) 97/23/EC
- ➤ Simple Pressure Vessels Directive (SPVD) 2009/105/EC (codification)
- > Supported by
 - Guidelines
 - Harmonised standards developed by CEN (EN)
 - Governance structure / stakeholder fora at national and European level: permanent dialogue



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Governance at EU level

- Horizontal framework level: Internal Market For Product (IMP) groups
 - NLF, market surveillance, accreditation/notification
- Sectoral level for each Directive, e.g. PED/SPVD:
 - Working Group Pressure (WGP)
 - Working Party Guidelines (WPG) and Materials (WPM)
 - Professional industry and users associations Orgalime, EIGA, AEGPL, EHI, ECUI, ...
 - CEN, CEN/PE AN, CABF PED/SPVD, EPERC





Policy context

- Evolution of <u>horizontal framework related to</u> <u>internal market for goods legislation / product</u> safety legislation
- Improve & simplify legislation sectoral legislation
 - evaluation + impact assessment for any legislative proposal
 - Regular evaluation of activities (programs, <u>policies</u> <u>including regulation</u>)
 - For PED: decision to conduct a stock-taking exercise 10 years after the Directive fully entered into force



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Evaluation study - Goal

- Evaluate to what extent the Directive achieved its main objectives: free circulation (Internal Market) while maintaining a high level of safety
- Identification of strengths and weaknesses, failures, ...
- Recommendations for possible measures for improvement / simplification
 - > Crucial step in policy development and identifying the need for revision / legal initiative





Evaluation study - Findings

PED performed well in general

- successfully combined market integration while maintaining the high levels of safety of the former national legislation in the Member States;
- ➤ improved functioning of the Internal Market and opened up intra-EU trading opportunities



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Evaluation study - Findings

The study also identified some concerns e.g.

- the effectiveness of the New Approach framework in general;
- the presence of non-compliant products placed on the market;
- weaknesses related to Market Surveillance (national competence) and Conformity Assessment Bodies etc.

But all together not enough reasons to start a full revision





Evaluation study - Where to find it?

- The evaluation report is not identifying some "well-known issues"
 - > Why ? Stakeholders didn't raise it in the consultation or the contractor didn't catch it ?
- Future actions will not be solely based on the results of the evaluation study but also on the lessons learned in the day-to-day management of the directive and input from stakeholders.



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New Legislative Framework (NLF)

- to improve the internal market for goods and strengthen the conditions for placing a wide range of products on the EU Market
- a package of measures that aim to improve market surveillance and boost the quality of conformity assessments. It also clarifies the use of CE marking and creates a toolbox of measures for use in product legislation.
- Adopted in 2008



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New Legislative Framework (NLF)

- Regulation (EC) 765/2008 setting out the requirements for accreditation and the market surveillance of products;
- <u>Decision 768/2008/EC</u> on a common framework for the marketing of products, which includes reference provisions to be incorporated whenever product legislation is revised, template for future product harmonisation legislation;
- <u>Regulation (EC) 764/2008</u> laying down procedures relating to the application of certain national technical rules to products lawfully marketed in another EU country.





New Legislative Framework (NLF)

- Some measures directly applicable
- Gradually implemented in the directives either
 - via an alignment to the NLF (ATEX, SPVD, lifts, EMC, LVD, pyrotechnics, civil explosives, PED, ...) or
 - via a full revision (Gas appliances, personal protective equipment, cableways, ...)

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NLF & PED and SPVD

- Alignment of SPVD to NLF and PED to NLF and CLP Regulation
- Alignment to the NLF mainly relates to Articles without substantial changes to the scope or Essential Safety Requirements
- Legislative procedure completed in 2014
 - New PED: 2014/68/EU (OJ L 189 of 27.06.2014)
 - New SPVD: 2014/29/EU (OJ L 96 of 29.03.2014)





New PED and SPVD

- Transposition into national law:
 - > **SPVD**: art. 42 (transposition by 19 April 2016) application as of **20 April 2016**
 - > **PED**: art. 49 (transposition by 18 July 2016) application as of **19 July 2016**
 - except for Article 13 (related to classification of fluids):
 transposition by 28 February 2015, application as of 1 June 2015!
- Existing guidelines will be updated where needed



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New PED

Alignment to the NLF Decision

[Decision No 768/2008/EC of the European Parliament and of the Council of 9 July 2008 on a common framework for the marketing of products and repealing Council Decision 93/465/EEC (OJ L 218, 13.8.2008, p. 82)]

Alignment to the CLP Regulation

[Regulation (EC) No 1272/2008 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 16 December 2008 on classification, labelling and packaging of substances and mixtures, amending and repealing Directives 67/548/EEC and 1999/45/EC, and amending Regulation (EC) No 1907/2006 (OJ L 353, 31.12.2008, p. 1).]

- Matter of urgency!
- Required because the legal base for the classification of fluids (Dangerous Substances Directive) in current PED Article 9 will be repealed on 31 May 2015





New SPVD

- Alignment to the NLF Decision
- Please note impact on the conformity assessment procedures
 - No longer in the articles but in an Annex
 - Based on definition of Modules in the NLF Decision
 - Existing standards need to be updated!



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Focus on better implementation

Focus for the next years on <u>better implementation</u> by means of <u>alignment to NLF</u> and <u>addressing some</u> <u>of the recommendations of the evaluation</u>

- ➤ Accreditation / CABs
- ➤ Market surveillance
- > Standardisation
- > Updating / streamlining Guidelines



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Preparatory work ... for the future

- Impact assessment study related to scope of Machinery Directive, ATEX and PED for equipment used in offshore oil and gas industries
 - > Possible extension of scope of
 - MD, ATEX and PED to mobile off-shore units (Article 1 §3.14)
 - > PED to well-control equipment (Article 1 §3.9)
 - > Stakeholder consultation in Q2 2015
 - > participate if you are concerned your input is needed
 - Final report: early 2016





Conclusion - longer term perspective

No full revision of the PED is currently planned

- > Stable legal framework for stationary pressure equipment for the years to come ...
- > But policies are evaluated regularly and external events may influence the process ...
- > Revision will anyhow be a lengthy process
 - > Requires minimum 3 to 5 years for legislation with such a wide scope and level of complexity
 - > evaluation, stakeholder involvement and consultation, impact assessment, drafting legislative proposal, ...
 - > legislative process involving the other EU Institutions
